The Orlando Metro Area has a population of 2.8 million and it is ranked the 22nd largest metropolitan area in the United States according to the 2020 Census. However, the area received over 75 million visitors in 2022, which makes Orlando the most visited destination in the country. This is equivalent to an entire population of United Kingdom visiting a single area every single year.

Theme parks have a significant role in these impressive numbers. However, the city offers attractions that go beyond that. For example, approximately 12% of such visitors travel to Orlando exclusively for business purposes. That's nearly 10 million people attending business meetings, trade shows, engineers in the aerospace industry, surgeons in medical activities or any other professional reasons. That amount of business visitors in Orlando are greater than most countries around the world. Shopping, for instance, is an event due to the variety of options and excellent value for money. There are also great outdoor activities and must-see cultural and sports events.

There are so many options that it's important to organize an itinerary to make the most of the city, whether you're alone, with your loved ones or attending a conference. SUNSHINE STATE

Florida is known for the exuberance of its landscapes.

In 1513, the Spanish explorer Juan Ponce de León discovered across the Atlantic Ocean, a place of extraordinary nature. Then, he named the region “Pascua Florida,” or “Flowery Easter,” in reference to the holiday at that time.

The name caught on in a shortened version, “La Florida.” And so, the peninsula, which has records of human occupation dating back at least 14,000 years, is known as Florida nowadays. It was the first territory controlled by Europeans in the entire area that now comprises the United States and Saint Augustine, located about 1 hour and 30 minutes from Orlando, is considered the first city established in the United States.

After three centuries of Spanish rule, with alternating periods of French and British control, Florida became American in 1819, when the Secretary of State and the future sixth President John Quincy Adams, signed the Adams-Onís Treaty. At the time, the underlying public reason was the border control as Spain was not being able to control fugitive slaves from Georgia seeking shelter in Florida and avoid the Seminole raids into

Georgia farms. But geopolitically, Florida acquisition meant alongside with the recent Louisiana purchase (1803) the full control of the Mississippi River from the Gulf of Mexico to the Big Lakes. To do so, the United States assumed debts of \$5 million that the Spanish owed to the locals for war reparations.

In 1821, Florida became an American territory governed by General Andrew Jackson (who would later become the seventh President. For internationals, he is the face on the \$20 bill). In 1845, it became the 27th state to join the federation. Currently, it is the third most populous state in the country. And, for valid reasons, it is often called the “Sunshine State” among Americans. In the late 19th century, it began to be sought after by many tourists.

According to an old story, Ponce de León even searched for a mythical Fountain of Youth in the region. Interestingly, Florida has become a highly sought-after place for people who settle there temporarily or permanently to improve their quality of life and, in a way, rejuvenate themselves.

THE LAND OF ORANGES

This city emerged as a military base and developed through citrus fruit production.

Just over 50 years ago, in 1971, on a piece of land as big as the city of San Francisco, CA, the Walt Disney World Resort revolutionized the theme park market worldwide - the Cinderella Castle, standing 200 feet tall, became the Disney's landmark. There are so many legendary stories of how Walt Disney incognito negotiated the formation of the land.

The success of this entrepreneurship also helped to shape Orlando. At that time, the city had approximately 50,000 inhabitants and was mainly known for the orange harvest. It is common to find references to this period in the streets, such as Orange Blossom Trail, Orange County and Orange Park. Orlando was also a base city where large citrus farmers would spend their winter vacations - that is why you will also find places like Winter Park and Winter Garden, among others.

The strategic position of the city, located in the center of the peninsula state has been an important military reference since the 19th century when there were wars between European colonizers and the Seminoles. It was during this time, around the 1840s, that the name of the city emerged - there are conflicting versions about the reason why the village became known as Orlando.



During World War II, this city was home to two United States Air Force bases. The military presence remains relevant to this day. Orlando is one of the main hubs of the American defense industry with several companies headquartered in Central Florida and is internationally famous for the Kennedy Space Center, NASA's launching site in Cape Canaveral, just 30 minutes east of Orlando. In 1969, the University of Central Florida (UCF) was founded to be the birthplace of aeronautical engineers for NASA.

- Few decades later, one of the "youngest" US colleges in US, UCF became the largest university in the country by student enrollment, with over 66,000 students and offering over 240-degree programs. The recipe formed by theme parks, defense industry and an outstanding education is leading to Orlando to be in the edge of the Simulation and Gaming Industry which currently is fast settling new tech companies in Central Florida.

From the 1970s onwards, theme parks transformed the region's characteristics. Alongside family tourism, event spaces gained momentum - the Orange County Convention Center is the second largest in the country - as well as large outlets and a lot of outdoor attractions. Orlando breathes tourism and knows very well how to welcome visitors.

Everyone knows Central Florida is Golfer's Paradise boasting over 200 private, public and resort courses around Orlando. But what are the top hidden gems you can play?

Dubsdread Golf Course

Located in Winter Park, this historic muni course was built in 1923 and is one of the locals favorite. Apparently shot with 6,153 yards, it is a demanding Par 70 that requires strategic placed shots while driving your cart thru Winter Park streets. Don't miss the opportunity to eat and/or drink at Tap Room, one of the best and most awarded golf restaurants in town.

Mission Inn

Home of 2 championship courses (El Campeón and Las Colinas), you cannot say you know golf in Orlando without playing El Campeon. It opened 1917 with dramatic elevation changes uncharacteristic for Central Florida, the course is one of the top lay outs of in Central Florida. The course tests the best juniors and college players in the nation as well as several pro tournaments including qualifiers for the US Open. It is a 45min drive from the tourist district but it is worth for the gofer enthusiasts. The sister course, Las Colinas, is equally good just not as famous.

Rio Pinar used to be mandatory stop for the likes of Jack Nicklaus, Julio Boros, Lee Trevino up to 1978. The course was recently bought by a new company who intends to bring the course back to its glory days.

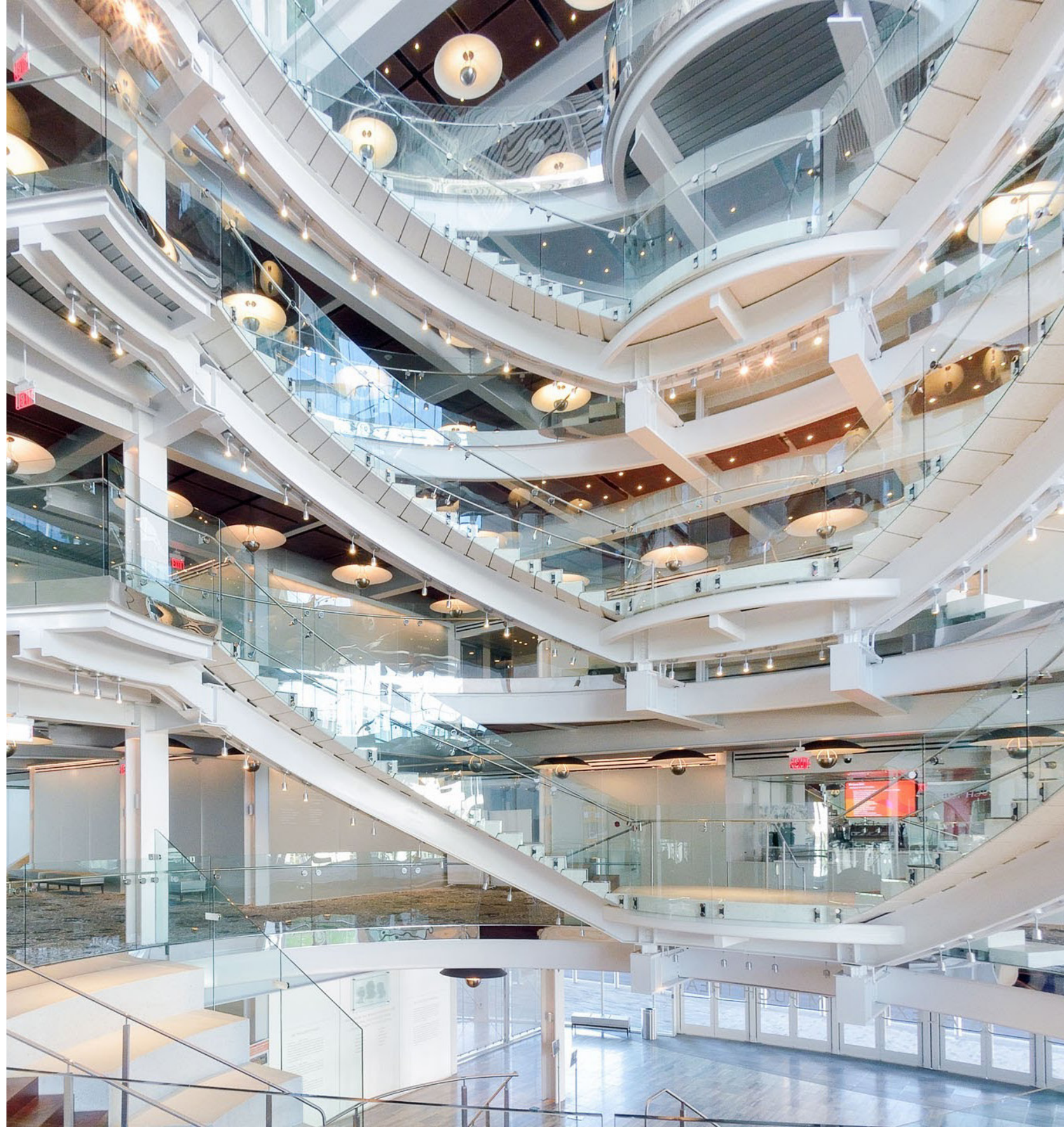
